







CISD LOCAL TAXES vs STATE FUNDS

- State funding is not adjusted to account for increased costs and inflation
- As property values increase, state funding actually decreases


EFFECTIVE 2007:

State regulates district M&O tax rate to \$1.04.
 State did not supplement dollar for dollar what was lost in taxes

(M&O reduced from \$1.30 to \$1.04)

EFFECTIVE 2019:

- State implements MCR (max. compressed rate). As property values increase, state decreases tax rate (M&O from \$1.04 to \$0.97 to \$0.8747 to \$0.872 now)
- The State benefits when property values increase not the district










Q5: What is your gender?




Q7: How satisfied are you with the quality of education in Crandall ISD schools?












DISTRICT ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS SUMMARY (PK-12)
